Larry Hubich is the president of the Saskatchewan Federation of Labour (SFL). He was elected as SFL President on July 3, 2002, re-elected in November 2002, October 2004 and again in November 2006. First elected to the SFL Executive Council in 1990 as a Vice-President, Hubich served as the SFL's Treasurer from 1994 until election to the position of President in 2002.

A long time trade unionist and social activist Larry was a staff representative with Grain Services Union (GSU) for 20 years (1982 – 2002). Prior to this he was a rank and file member of GSU from 1973 – 1982 while he was employed in the Information Technology Division at Saskatchewan Wheat Pool.

Larry grew up in small town Saskatchewan (Strasbourg & Leader), graduated from High School in Leader, Sask. in 1972 and since that time has continued in his educational pursuits. A life-long learner, he has attended post-secondary institutions including the Saskatchewan Technical Institute (STI – Moose Jaw) and the University of Regina.
