

Larry Hubich President Saskatchewan Federation of Labour



Larry Hubich is the president of the Saskatchewan Federation of Labour (SFL).

He has served as the SFL's President since he was first elected on July 3, 2002, and is currently in his 4th term. He also served as the SFL's Treasurer for 8 years prior to his election as President.

A long time trade unionist and social activist Larry was a staff representative with Grain Services Union (GSU/ILWU) for 20 years (1982 – 2002). Prior to this he was a rank and file member of GSU from 1973 – 1982 while he was employed in the Information Technology Division at Saskatchewan Wheat Pool.

A computer systems specialist by training, he also has extensive experience and a strong background in Labour Education. Larry has co-instructed classes in Labour Law recognized and accredited by the University of Saskatchewan and the Labour College of Canada.

An experienced negotiator and advocate for working people, Larry has experience in the areas of labour arbitration, collective bargaining, organizing, education, communication, finance, and information technology. He represents Saskatchewan workers on both the provincial and national stage by participating and working with many unions and numerous organizations at all levels.

Throughout his entire career, Larry has been steadfast in the defense of worker's rights. He is currently overseeing the combined effort of SFL affiliates who have launched an unprecedented legal action against the Saskatchewan government for the passing of legislation which violates the constitutional rights of Saskatchewan workers. In addition, Larry oversaw the filing of a successful complaint, at the United Nations International Labour Organization, against the Saskatchewan government's introduction of Bills 5 & 6.

In addition to his responsibilities as SFL President, Larry Hubich is an active member of the Canadian Labour Congress Executive Council. He served as the interim Chair following the founding of the Saskatchewan Potash Council and he is past Co-Chair of the Saskatchewan Labour Force Development Board and past Co-Chair of the Saskatchewan Labour Market Commission.

Larry and his wife Fran have made their home in Regina, SK. for more than 30 years, and have 3 adult children.
